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Palmetto Charter School Middle School Summer Assignment – Rising to 6th Grade

Part I Instructions:

- Read the non-fiction book Fred Korematsu Speaks Up by Laura Adkins and Stan Yogi
- Write a five-paragraph essay based on the book according to the prompt below.

<u>Writing prompt</u>: Fred Korematsu is considered a hero who fought for social justice for the treatment of Japanese-Americans during WWII. How does Fred Korematsu display the characteristics of a hero?

Your essay must include:

- An introductory paragraph that contains a hook, the title and author of the book, and a claim that includes three characteristics. (5 points)
- Three body paragraphs that have a topic sentence, 5-7 sentences of details from the text and explanations supporting one of the three characteristics, and a concluding sentence. (15 points)
- A conclusion paragraph that summarizes your essay and restates your claim. (5 points)
- Follows correct spelling, grammar, and punctuation. (5 points)
- You may neatly handwrite or type your essay.

Part II Instructions:

- Read a fiction book of your choice. Do not read a book in which you have already taken an AR test. If you're not sure, don't read it.
- The book must be at least a 4.0 or higher reading level and at least 100 pages long.
- A list of suggested books per grade is posted on pcsfl.org.
- Use ARBookfinder.com to determine if an AR quiz is available for your book BEFORE you read it.
- Complete the attached book information card to help you remember the fiction book. (15 points)
- When you return to school in the fall, **be prepared to take an AR test** for each book and turn in your completed attachments. (25 points each AR test)
- You may read your required yearly classic novel this summer. A suggested list is posted on pcsfl.org.
 <u>Extra Credit Option</u>
- You may read more than two books to earn extra credit. You must pass the AR test to earn extra credit and complete information cards for each book. Maximum two extra books/10 points extra credit.

Part III Instructions:

- **Practice your cursive handwriting** by completing the attached packet. The dotted lines should be completed as well as the blank lines.
- Complete all parts of the packet for full credit. (25 points)

Extra Credit Option

- Download and print additional cursive writing pages from the internet. Complete up to 5 pages of additional cursive practice for a maximum of 5 points extra credit.
